

The Parish of Threshfield

Threshfield is a small village and civil parish in the Craven district of North Yorkshire, with a population of approximately 1000 residents.

In the 16th century, Threshfield was part of a huge deer park. The Old Hall, a Georgian inn which takes its name from the 14th century hall at the rear, was built by monks and is reputedly the oldest inhabited building in Wharfedale.

Threshfield School is a primary school for ages of 4–11 years. The school was built in 1674 and is now a Grade II listed building. Upper Wharfedale School is a mixed secondary school for ages 11–16 years. The school has around 320 pupils enrolled making it smaller than the average secondary school. It is a Sports College and was recently voted the most improved school in North Yorkshire.

Threshfield is home to Wharfedale Rugby Union Football Club, who play in National Division One.

On 5 July 2014, the Tour de France, and on 29th April 2016, the Tour of Yorkshire passed through the village
